## TCC Releases Press Release on Spearhead Trails' Attempt to be Exempt from Environmental Oversight and Regulations

Last month, the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), pursuant to a public records request, released a new batch of public documents related to environmental concerns on the Spearhead Trails system, a 600-mile network of off-road vehicle trails funded by Virginia taxpayers and managed by the Southwest Regional Recreation Authority (SRRA). 
The Clinch Coalition's Hiking Club hosted the club's first, First Day Hike January 1, 2023. Hikers, nine people and two dogs, met at the Bark Camp Lake Boat Ramp parking lot. A dense fog was covering the lake and when we started walking, the wind blew the mist across our faces. TCC Honors Co-founder Dick Austin

IIn 1998, Richard (Dick) Austin became a co-founder of The Clinch Coalition, along with Steve Brooks, Otis Ward, and Joe and Gerry Scardo. Their organizing skills brought together local residents to protest the excessive logging in the Clinch Ranger District of the Jefferson National Forest, which at that time included the destructive clear cutting of the forest.

Their actions - using a petition that gathered several thousand signatures, community meetings, rallies and even a Smokin' Bear billboard – brought enough pushback to get the USFS to cut in half the acreage they had proposed to log. The newly formed Clinch Coalition developed a position statement opposed to all commercial logging in the national forest. Logging continues to this day, but TCC challenges logging proposals and then monitors logging sites for best management practices. Austin became an environmental theologian out of his pastoral experience in West Virginia. He holds a Bachelor of Arts from Swarthmore College (1956), a Master of Divinity from Union Theological Seminary (1959), and a Doctor of the Science of Theology from San Francisco Theological Seminary (1975).

Austin led a campaign to abolish strip mining in West Virginia in 1971, then co-chaired the Citizens to Abolish Strip Mining that lobbied U.S. Congress to pass anti-strip-mining legislation. The bill passed in Congress but was vetoed by President Ford. Partial success was achieved when President Jimmy Carter signed the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act in 1977. Moving to Dungannon, VA, Austin became active in local environmental issues. He is an author whose early books include Environmental Theology, Baptized into Wilderness, Beauty of the Lord, Hope for Land, and Reclaiming America. An oral history has been videoed with Austin as part of an archival project by UVA-Wise students under the direction of Dr. Jinny Turman. The video is available at
